STANDING ORDER

In order to ensure the safety and well-being of all judicial officers, judicial staff, district court employees, clerk of courts, clerk of courts' employees, justice court employees, attorneys, litigants, law enforcement personnel, juvenile probation staff, department of correction staff, court security, potential jurors, jurors and visitors, the First Judicial District Court, the Lewis and Clark County Justice Court and the Broadwater County Justice Court adopt the following Standing Order prohibiting any concealed weapons in the Lewis and Clark County Courthouse or the Broadwater County Courthouse.

The First Judicial District Court and the Lewis and Clark County

Justice Court find that the entirety of the Lewis and Clark County Courthouse is

used by court personnel, to include judges, clerks, support staff, court security,

attorneys, parties to court actions, jurors, and witnesses. The Lewis and Clark County Courthouse has a fully manned security screening checkpoint at each entrance, which includes a metal detector and a screening device for bags or containers.

The First Judicial District Court and the Broadwater County

Justice Court also find that all personnel who access the Broadwater County

Courthouse for court purposes must enter through the public entrances on the

Courthouse's first floor or from the secure facility of the Broadwater County

Sheriff's Office. There is no barrier or screening point which separates

courthouse areas used for entry to the building from courthouse areas used for actual court proceedings.

The Courts find that their inherent authority and responsibility to preserve and enforce order in its proceedings, and the conduct of ministerial officers and all other persons associated in any manner with a judicial proceeding, pursuant to Mont. Code Ann. §§ 3-1-111 and 3-3-402, requires an order to govern the possession of firearms in the Lewis and Clark and Broadwater County Courthouses.

Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that a person with a current and valid concealed weapon permit issued pursuant to Mont. Code Ann. § 45-8-321 or recognized pursuant to Mont. Code Ann. § 45-8-329 is prohibited from bringing a concealed weapon into the Lewis and Clark County Courthouse or the Broadwater County Courthouse.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that no individual may possess, concealed or otherwise, any weapon, including but not limited to a firearm, in the Lewis and Clark County Courthouse or the Broadwater County Courthouse

unless that person is a duly sworn law enforcement officer, courthouse security personnel, or a civil officer or deputy civil officer engaged in the discharge of official business.

The First Judicial District Judges, the Lewis and Clark County
Justices of Peace and the Broadwater County Justice of Peace will continue to
assess this Standing Order in the event it needs to be vacated, extended, or
amended as circumstances require.
